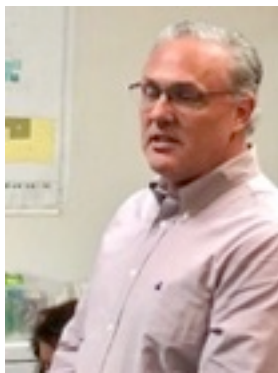

Spring Primary February 19, 2019 General Election April 2, 2019

Portage County voters will be electing a Wisconsin Supreme Court Judge, and Appeals Court Judge, three Stevens Point School Board members, the Stevens Point mayor, Stevens Point City Clerk, Six Stevens Point Alders, Village of Plover President, three Village of Plover Trustees and several Supervisors and trustees in towns and villages throughout Portage County.

Candidate nomination papers are not due until January 2, 2019. More information on who will be running for various offices in the February primary election will be included in the February newsletter.

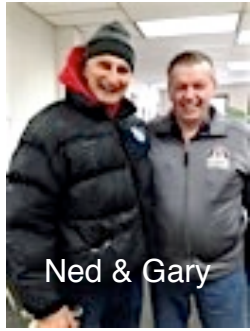

NEW DATA LAYS BARE IMPACT OF WISCONSIN GERRYMANDERING - excerpted from [USA Today](#) by Craig Gilbert

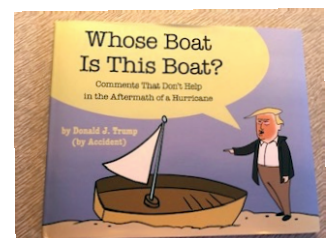
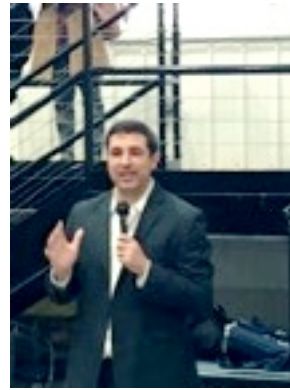
Detailed election data posted by the state illustrates the ongoing impact of Wisconsin's gerrymandered Republican-friendly legislative map.

Governor Walker lost his bid for election by roughly 1 % point to Democrat Tony Evers on November 6th. Yet Walker carried 63 of the state's 99 state Assembly districts. Data shows that 64 of the 99 districts are more Republican than the state as a whole based on their vote for governor. Republicans enjoy a built-in 64-35 advantage in the partisan makeup of the 99 assembly districts.

The legislative map drawn by the GOP in 2011 added to the Republican advantage by drawing lopsided but safe GOP districts and leaving the Democratic concentrated metropolitan areas around Madison and Milwaukee intact. That leaves hardly any "purple" Assembly districts in a "purple" state. Democrats had to outperform the GOP by 9 or 10 points statewide to have a shot at winning control of the Assembly. On November 6th, only 5 of the 99 Assembly races were decided by less than 5 points and only two were decided by less than 3 points.

There is some good news however. The victory of Evers et al. November 6th, means the next legislative map (in place for the 2022 elections) will likely be less partisan than the current one because it will be the product of a divided government.
