HEADQUARTER'S HISTORY

At the September 11th meeting, local historian and recently retired Portage County Librarian, Wendell Nelson, provided a very interesting history and a few historical pictures of our building at 2220 Division St.

From Mr. Nelson's research, we learned that Samuel Glover constructed a new building on this site in 1877 where tin, copper and sheet-iron wares were produced. That building burned down in 1888. The rubble was cleared and a new double building (consisting of our HQ at 2220 Division and the attached building to the north, 2216 Division) was built by Glover and Samuel Feldman.

Throughout the years, the building was owned by the following parties:

Feldman & Glover Hardware & Grocery Store: 1888 - 1901

International Order of Odd Fellows (IOOF) Lodge Hall: 1901 - 1945

Eagles Lodge Hall: 1945 - 1955

General Drivers Union Local 354: 1955 – 1985

General Teamsters Union Local 662: 1985 – 2011

Portage Co Democratic Party purchased the building on **Nov. 22, 2011.**

It is coincidental that the building served several worker Unions through the years and now houses the County Democratic Party!! Or is it?

PROGRAM FOR OCTOBER 9th PCDP MEETING

Discussion - Important Referendums on November 6 Ballot

At our October general meeting, there will be a discussion of each of the referenda that will appear on the ballot in November. There are three county referenda:

- 1) **Ben Kollock** will discuss the advisory referendum on medical marijuana.
- 2) **Tom Mallison**, Portage County Treasurer, will discuss the advisory “dark store” referendum dealing with property taxes on large buildings.
- 3) **Meleesa Johnson** – City Alder & County Board Supervisor will discuss the binding referendum dealing with County Health Care Center; it funds the facility by providing \$1.4 million for each of the next four years.



In addition, for those who live in the Stevens Point Area School District, School Board member **Trish Baker** will discuss an additional two referenda whereby the district can:

- 1) exceed tax limits by \$3.5 million per year for district operation expenses; and
- 2) borrow \$75.9 million for maintenance & construction.

Please join us Tuesday, Oct 9th, at 6:30 pm to learn more about these referenda. Your Executive Board has already gone on record *in support* of all five.
